Video Capture powered by GoReact is a unique assignment type in Connect. GoReact is a video observation and assessment tool for use in higher education. Communicating effectively is a critical skill that students develop in Communication and Business Communication courses. Video Capture enables instructors to evaluate presentations while giving students the freedom to practice their presentation skills anytime and anywhere. Through GoReact, students upload or live-record videos of their speeches/presentations. Instructors and/or peers may give feedback on the recorded presentations in the form of time-coded text, video, or audio feedback. Recorded speech assignments can be scored or graded using customized rubrics. Reports enable tracking and measurement of student progress and outcomes.

the whole section. To reset the assignment for one or more students, please contact our Customer Experience Group (CXG) and request that the Connect Support team delete the student's attempt. Then you can give an extension or change the due date to reopen the assignment for those students who need access. Deleting the attempt will not remove previous work, e.g., videos that a student may have already recorded or comments on a peer's video.

Any extensions or date changes need to happen BEFORE the original due date to ensure nothing is automatically submitted and the attempt stays open. Changing dates or providing an extension will give more time to students who have never opened the assignment. For students who did access the assignment (and are locked out as a result), please contact our Customer Experience Group (CXG) and request that the Connect Support team delete the student's attempt. Then you can give an extension or change the due date to reopen the assignment. Deleting the attempt will not remove previous work, e.g., videos that a student may have already recorded or comments on a peer's video.

Unless you opt for a single recording attempt on the activity settings page, GoReact allows students to record as many videos as they choose, so in that sense, students do have multiple attempts/can have multiple submissions. Whatever a student does in the GoReact tool (whether that's nothing, recording 1 video, recording multiple videos), that counts as one attempt. However, once that attempt is submitted on the due date, the student has no further attempts to record, upload, or provide feedback.

Video Capture is a single-attempt assignment because speeches or presentations often include a collaborative element, such as peer review. Students need to all access the same attempt on the assignment in order to record their own videos for others to evaluate and in turn, to evaluate videos of their peers. If we did allow multiple attempts, there would be no way of ensuring that students have a peer speech to evaluate in the 2nd or 3rd attempt.

We implemented forced submission on Video Capture assignments for two reasons:

- The GoReact interface does not have a SUBMIT button, so students could potentially upload a video but forget to submit the assignment, thus earning an unexpected zero.
- Without a SUBMIT button, the system has no way of knowing the assignment status. A student would perpetually be "in progress." and you would have no way of locking down the assignment at the due date/time.

Due to the forced submission policy, Connect automatically submits whatever work a student has completed in a video capture assignment on the due date, even if they haven't done anything at all. The student activity page recognizes those cases in which a student opened the assignment and never recorded or uploaded a video as a "submission." The GoReact

dashboard, however, will only show videos that have been uploaded or recorded successfully. That's why you are seeing a discrepancy between the number of submissions and the videos available to grade. Likely, you're not seeing a student's video because either they never uploaded or recorded one while the assignment was open, or they deleted the video. If the latter, the video should still appear in the "Deleted" tab for the student but will not be visible to you.

Yes, but the rubric score will need to be manually updated in your LMS and will not appear in Connect reports. If you do not use an LMS, you'll need to manually update that score in whatever gradebook you use. Open the assignment and click on "Grade Student Submissions." Then click on "Start Assignment" to add a title, tag the correct student as the Presenter, and then select and upload the video file. Once uploaded/processed, click on the video thumbnail to add feedback, score your rubric, and post the scores/feedback. You'll see an asterisk next to the rubric score on the grading dashboard indicating that the grade must be manually updated. This can be done after the due date, but the grade you enter manually will not feed back to the student activity page in GoReact.

Instructors and Reviewers can always see all comments on all videos. Presenters can view all comments on their OWN videos (i.e. where they are the Presenter). When using peer review, Peers can see only their OWN comments on other people's videos, unless the option "All comments are public" is enabled during assignment set-up.

Yes. Video Capture allows for both live feedback (during a presentation) and after-the-fact feedback. If needed, you can do both — critique the presentation live, then go back later for edits and additional comments.

As many GoReact users as you like may review a video, as long as you've given them permission to do so. The reviewer must be in your Connect section to give feedback.
