If a sentence begins with **if**, **unless** or **although**, the sentence needs a comma. Three more sentences in part C need commas. Fix up those sentences. (Observe)

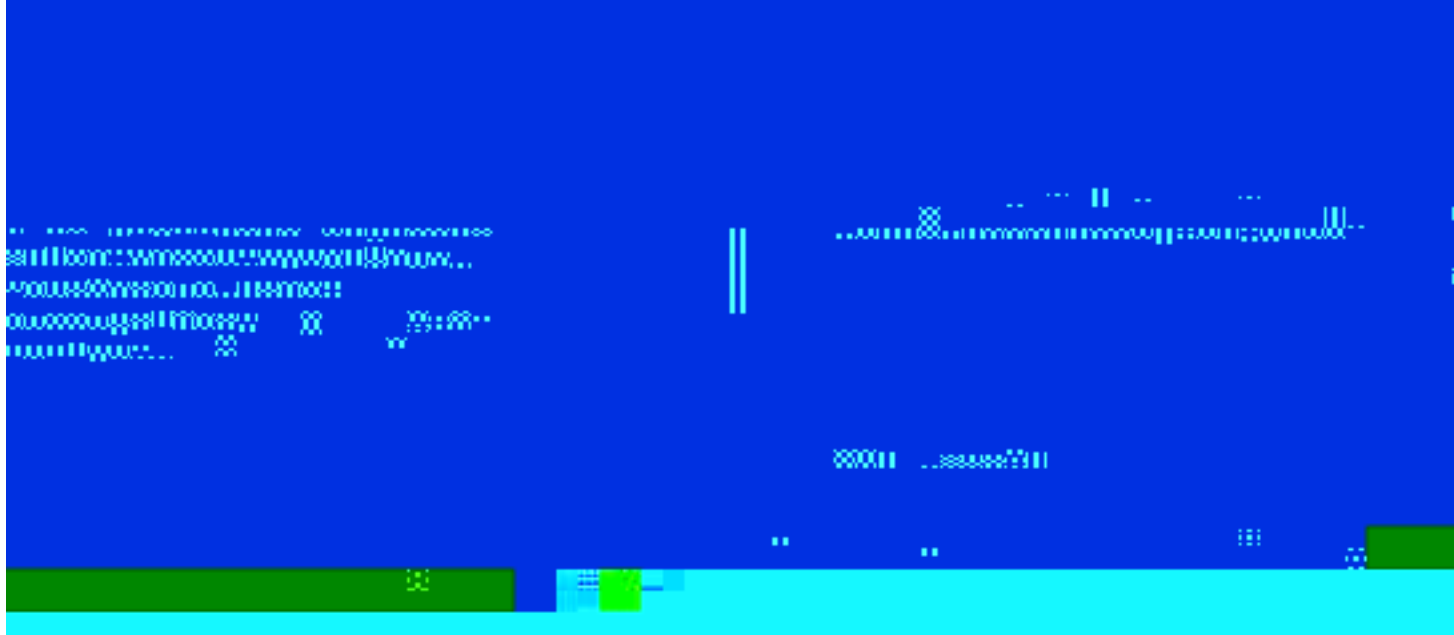
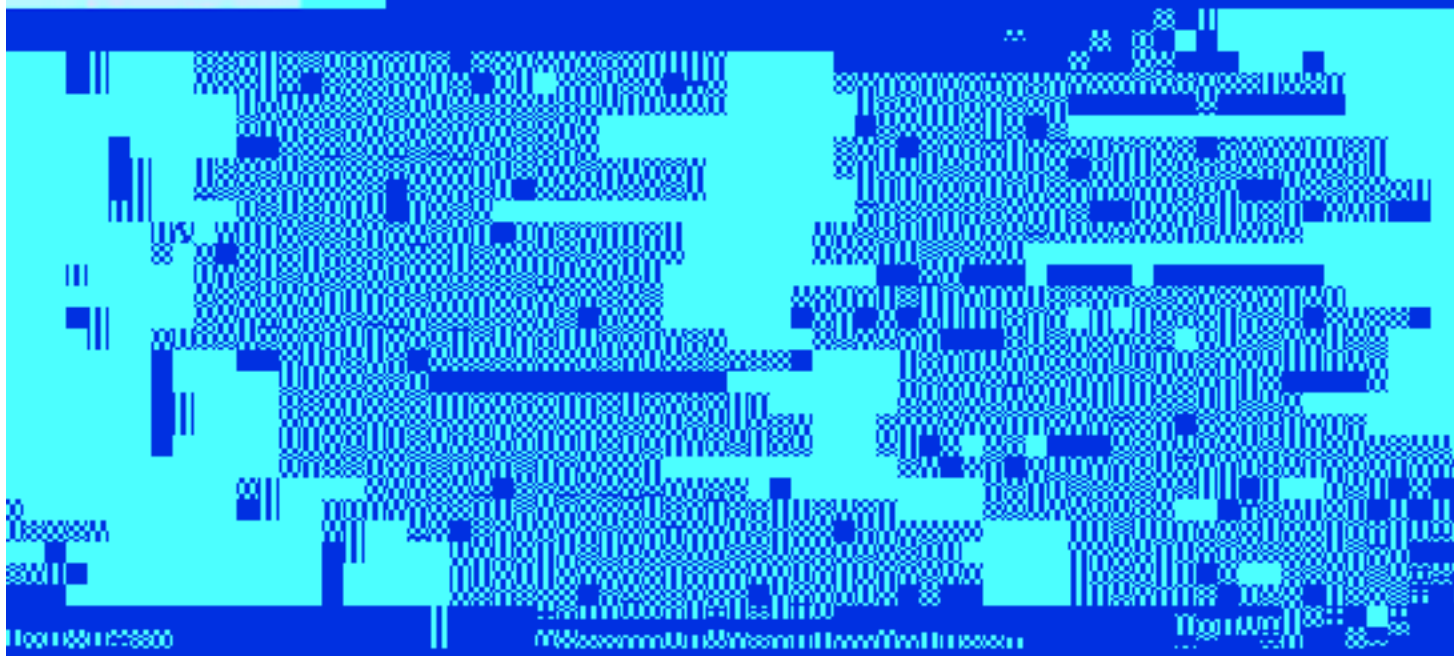
